## TRADITION

Mercer University was founded in 1833 under the leadership of Jesse Mercer, a prominent Georgia Baptist. The second largest Baptist-affiliated institution in the world, Mercer is the only independent university of its size in the country to offer comprehensive programs in liberal arts, business, education, engineering, medicine, music, nursing, pharmacy, physician assistant studies, theology, and law. In 1903, the Southern College of Pharmacy opened in Atlanta as an independent, privately-owned college. A merger with Mercer University was completed in 1959. During its long history, the College developed a tradition of excellence and a reputation for producing outstanding leaders in healthcare, not only in Georgia but also throughout the country.

## OUR PROGRAMS

### Master of Medical Science (Physician Assistant Program)

In January 2008 the College enrolled students in the Physician Assistant Program. This program is a 28-month program that consists of a 13-month didactic phase and a 15-month clinical and professional didactic phase and leads to the Master of Medical Science (MMSc) degree.

The mission of the Mercer University College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences Physician Assistant Program is to educate patient-centered medical providers of the highest quality who are leaders, life-long learners, possess an appreciation of ethical values and human diversity, and are provided a foundation to practice in every discipline of allopathic medicine. The Physician Assistant Program emphasizes evidence-based medicine, informatics, critical decision making, interdisciplinary teamwork, and continuous quality improvement.



### Profile of the Physician Assistant Graduate

The Physician Assistant graduate of the Mercer University College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences will be able to:

- + Elicit an accurate and thorough medical history.
- + Perform a complete and problem focused physical examination.
- + Develop a diagnostic plan using medical informatics and evidence-based medicine.
- + Initiate an individualized therapeutic management plan.
- + Provide patient-centered verbal and written instructions.
- + Accurately document medical records.
- + Perform medical and surgical procedures consistent with a primary care physician assistant.
- + Promote administrative, management, and research skills.
- + Demonstrate a commitment to professionalism in all situations.
- + Dedicate one's self to a process of life-long learning.

### Physician Assistant Program Admissions Requirements

The following requirements and standards are designed to ensure scholastic and professional success in Mercer's Physician Assistant Program. Selecting a candidate for future practice as a physician assistant involves many important factors, including academic background, GRE scores, extracurricular activities, and clinical experience.

- + Completion of a Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited university and completion of the pre-Physician Assistant coursework.
- + Preferred cumulative undergraduate (and relevant Science-related graduate) GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale and undergraduate Natural Science GPA of 2.75 or better.
- + Official Graduate Record Examination (GRE) scores from the general test: verbal, quantitative, and analytical sections. Preference is given to applicants whose combined scores are 1000 or above for the verbal and quantitative sections. In certain circumstances, special consideration will be given to highly qualified candidates with combined GRE scores below 1000. Scores from all three sections must be submitted for application consideration. Please use school code 5025 and department code 0699 to ensure official scores are sent to the Student Affairs and Admissions office.
- + Submission of three letters of reference—one from a PA or physician, one from a university instructor, one additional non-relative.
- + Documentation of clinical experience that demonstrates direct (hands on) patient care (1,000 hours preferred). The following are some accepted categories for experience:

- + All applicants must be able to meet the Program's Technical Standards.

International applicants must also meet additional requirements regarding foreign course evaluations and English proficiency which are listed on our website.

Candidates may strengthen their application by completing any of the following recommended courses: Cell Biology, Embryology, Endocrinology, Ethics, Genetics, Histology, Immunology, Neuroscience, Organic Chemistry II, and Speech.



### Additionally:

- + All anatomy, physiology and microbiology coursework must be completed within the last 10 years.
- + Survey courses do not meet the prerequisite requirements.
- + Only grades of C or better are acceptable for prerequisite coursework.
- + Applicants may be “conditionally” accepted with up to two prerequisite courses pending; however all the coursework must be completed prior to matriculation.
- + The PA program does not award advanced placement of transfer credits.



### Doctor of Pharmacy

In 1981, Mercer's College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences became the first pharmacy school in the Southeast and fifth in the nation to offer the Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) degree as its sole professional degree. This program requires six years of study following high school: a minimum of two years of pre-pharmacy education at an accredited college or university and four years of professional education at Mercer's College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences.

Mercer's Doctor of Pharmacy degree program is designed to provide the scholastic expertise and clinical acumen necessary to give high-quality care to patients in a variety of settings. Career opportunities are many and varied – community practice, clinical pharmacy, and the pharmaceutical industry are just a few examples. Alternatives such as consulting pharmacy, nuclear pharmacy, drug information, managed care, geriatric, psychiatric or pediatric specialties, and teaching offer flexibility and growth to the Pharm.D. graduate. It makes good professional and financial sense to have a strong, competitive education.

Unique to Mercer's Pharm.D. program are two exceptional opportunities during the fourth year experiential education. The International Pharmacy Program provides fourth year students with an elective five-week practice experience in one of our approved international sites. Locations have included Australia, the Bahamas, Denmark, England, Japan, and Scotland. The Indian Health Service (IHS) Program allows the fourth year student to gain experience as a member of the IHS health care team with pharmacists, physicians, and nurses. Sites have included Parker, Keems Canyon, and San Carlos, Arizona and Gallup, New Mexico.



### Profile of the Doctor of Pharmacy Graduate

The Doctor of Pharmacy graduate of the Mercer University College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences will be able to:

- + Deliver pharmaceutical care based on sound scientific knowledge.
- + Solve problems and think critically.
- + Effectively counsel patients.
- + Educate the public and health care professionals.
- + Identify, resolve and prevent adverse drug reactions in order to protect the public.
- + Monitor therapeutic outcomes.
- + Effectively manage resources based on sound financial knowledge and administrative skills.
- + Adhere to state and federal laws regulating the practice of pharmacy.
- + Adhere to professional and ethical standards of conduct.
- + Participate in professional organizations.
- + Proactively address changes in the health care delivery system.
- + Pursue life-long learning.

### Doctor of Pharmacy Program Admissions Requirements

The following requirements and standards are designed to ensure scholastic and professional success in Mercer's Pharm.D. degree program. Selecting a candidate for future practice as a pharmacist involves many important factors, including academic background, PCAT scores, extracurricular activities, and pharmacy experience.

Applicants to the Doctor of Pharmacy degree program are required to complete the PharmCAS application ([www.pharmcas.org](http://www.pharmcas.org)). Applicants must also submit official transcripts, PCAT scores, and a minimum of two letters of reference to PharmCAS. At least one academic and one professional letter of reference are recommended. In addition to the PharmCAS application, applicants must submit a supplemental application (via the COPHS website, <http://cophs.mercer.edu>), and supplemental application fee.

All applicants are required to complete the pre-pharmacy courses listed below at an accredited college or university with grades of C or better. Each applicant must complete a minimum of 60 semester hours of college credit. In recent years, at least half of each entering class received bachelor's degrees prior to enrollment in the Doctor of Pharmacy degree program.

The competitive GPA needed in order to qualify for a personal interview is determined by the overall strength of each year's applicant pool. Grades for all undergraduate coursework attempted are included in this calculation. The average GPA for students accepted in recent years has been 3.50. An overall GPA above 3.0 is preferred.

All applicants are required to take the Pharmacy College Admissions Test (PCAT) and submit their scores to PharmCAS. The average PCAT score for students accepted in recent years has been 85. A composite percentile above 60 is preferred.

All applicants must be able to meet the Program's Technical Standards for Admission, Promotion, and Graduation.

International applicants to the Doctor of Pharmacy degree program must meet requirements regarding foreign coursework which are listed on our website.



## Doctor of Philosophy in Pharmaceutical Sciences

The graduate program leading to the Doctor of Philosophy degree in Pharmaceutical Sciences is designed for students seeking teaching and research careers in academic institutions, the pharmaceutical industry, and other health-related agencies. An interdisciplinary approach prepares graduates to perform independent research, to encourage scholarly development, and to acquire teaching skills. Areas of specialization include pharmacology, pharmaceuticals, toxicology, and medicinal chemistry.

A minimum of 70 hours including 35 hours of approved graduate-level coursework and 35 hours of dissertation research is required for completion of the degree. Requirements for the degree, however, are not determined solely in terms of a fixed number of courses, credits and years of residence. Graduate programs are highly individualized and are tailored to the characteristics and interests of the individual student.

## Additional Programs

*Doctor of Pharmacy / Master of Business Administration (Pharm.D./M.B.A.)*

The MBA complements the Pharm.D. degree by broadening the occupational and professional opportunities of the prospective graduate in community, industry, or institutional practice. The program has been carefully designed to permit concurrent pursuit of both degrees. Individual situations and length of MBA matriculation may vary. All applicants must meet admission requirements for the MBA program as well as the Pharm.D. program.

*Doctor of Pharmacy / Doctor of Philosophy (Pharm.D./ Ph.D.)*

The purpose of the Pharm.D. / Ph.D. degree program is to enable highly qualified students who are strongly motivated toward an academic/research career in pharmaceutical sciences to obtain both degrees in a shortened period of time. All applicants must have a bachelor's degree and must meet admissions requirements for the Ph.D. program as well as the Pharm.D. degree program.



## Residencies

The College offers a limited number of post-doctoral residencies to qualified individuals each year. A residency affords the Pharm.D. graduate an additional year of intensive training to develop expertise in areas such as drug information or community pharmacy. Application is made through the College's Department of Pharmacy Practice.

## Profile of the Doctor of Philosophy Graduate

The Doctor of Philosophy graduate of the Mercer University College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences will be able to:

- + Demonstrate a comprehensive knowledge of the core areas of the pharmaceutical sciences.
- + Successfully conduct all aspects of research in the pharmaceutical sciences.
- + Demonstrate knowledge of research methodology in their selected field of the pharmaceutical sciences.
- + Demonstrate knowledge of scientific advances in their selected field of pharmaceutical sciences.
- + Identify problems in the pharmaceutical sciences and formulate appropriate solutions to these problems.
- + Communicate effectively in both written and oral forms.
- + Appropriately gather and analyze data using various information technologies.
- + Understand the importance of continuing professional development, self-improvement, and life-long learning.
- + Adhere to professional and ethical responsibilities.



## Doctor of Philosophy Program Admissions Requirements

The following requirements and standards are designed to ensure scholastic and professional success in the College's Doctor of Philosophy degree program. Applications for admission to the Ph.D. degree program are evaluated by the faculty of the Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences. Acceptance into the graduate program in Pharmaceutical Sciences is based on the overall record and ability of the applicant. Applicants failing to meet the required minimum grade point average (GPA) or the required minimum Graduate Record Examination (GRE) score may be considered for admission provided their record is indicative of exceptional ability.

Minimum expectations for consideration for admission into the Doctor of Philosophy degree program include the following:

- + A Bachelor of Science degree in Pharmacy, Chemistry, Biology, or an equivalent degree in a related area, or a Pharm.D. degree;
- + A minimum GPA of 3.0 based on a 4.0 scale;
- + A minimum GRE score of 1000 (composite of verbal and quantitative sections);
- + Applicants from a country where the primary language is other than English must have a minimum score of 550 on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), or a minimum score of 213 on the computer-based TOEFL;
- + Applicants with degrees that have not been earned at an accredited United States institution must also meet additional requirements regarding foreign course evaluations which are listed on our website.

Application for admission must be made on forms that may be obtained from the Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences or the COPHS website. An application cannot be given final consideration until all required components have been received. A complete application consists of the following:

- + A nonrefundable \$25 application fee, the application form, and additional information requested on the application form.
- + Official transcripts sent directly from the applicant's accredited college / university.
- + Official GRE scores. Please use institution code 5623 to report scores.
- + Official TOEFL scores (if required). Please use institution code 5623 to report scores.
- + Completed recommendation forms from three persons who are able to judge the applicant's accomplishments and academic ability. Recommendation forms are available on the COPHS website and should be sent directly to the Director of the Graduate Program.

The application deadline for the Doctor of Philosophy degree program is May 15 for the fall term and September 1 for the spring term. Applications received after these deadlines will be reviewed the next available semester.

## Our Students

Life at Mercer's College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences is more than science textbooks, white coats, and lab bottles. It is rich in personal growth, good times, and fellowship designed to form friendships that last a lifetime.

With an enrollment of over 600 students, the College is small enough to achieve an integration of high academic standards and attention to the individual student. Mercer attracts a diverse group of students from all over the U.S. and the world. This diversity is another indication of excellence, impressive reputation and of honored tradition at Mercer University.



Student professionalism is an essential component of the College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences. Students become involved in national and state organizations by joining student chapters at Mercer. The Academy of Student Pharmacists (American Pharmacists Association), Georgia Pharmacy Association, National Community Pharmacists Association, American Society of Health-System Pharmacists, Georgia Society of Health-System Pharmacists, Student National Pharmaceuti-

cal Association, Academy of Managed Care Pharmacy, American Society of Consultant Pharmacists, Student Academy of the American Academy of Physician Assistants, the Georgia Association of Physician Assistants, and American Association of Pharmaceutical Scientists offer membership to students.

Student government is active through the Council of Students, which sponsors the annual Spring Picnic. Each class also elects officers. A chapter of Christian Pharmacists Fellowship International offers a non-denominational student support group. Additionally, three pharmacy fraternities have chapters at Mercer: Kappa Epsilon, Kappa Psi, and Phi Delta Chi. The Inter-Fraternity Council represents each of them.

Students are selected for membership in Rho Chi, the academic honor society in pharmacy, based on their high academic achievement. Students may also be selected for membership in the honor society Phi Kappa Phi. Phi Lambda Sigma is the pharmacy leadership society that recognizes students who, through leadership and conscientious service, contribute to the advancement of pharmacy. Various awards and scholarships are awarded to students who demonstrate outstanding academic achievement, leadership, and professionalism.

## Guaranteed Admission Plus Degree Programs

Two Guaranteed Admissions Plus Degree programs (GAPDP) are offered exclusively for students enrolled at Mercer's College of Liberal Arts (CLA) in Macon. Pre-pharmacy students at CLA choose the Pharmacy GAPDP, while pre-physician assistant students at CLA choose the Physician Assistant GAPDP.



All GAPDP students must meet curricular requirements of their particular program and are awarded a Bachelor of Science in Health Science degree upon completion of three years at CLA and one year of coursework in the College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences. Additional advantages of these programs include close academic advisement and waiver of supplemental application fees and tuition deposits / matriculation fees.

A Pharmacy GAPDP student must meet the following requirements in order to matriculate into Mercer's Pharm.D. Program:

- ✦ Complete of all pre-pharmacy coursework at Mercer's CLA (90 semester hours in-residence).
- ✦ Maintain an overall grade point average (GPA) of 3.0, as well as a 3.0 GPA in all math and science courses for the pre-pharmacy core and major. Grades of "C" or above must be earned in all pre-pharmacy courses.
- ✦ Document 500 hours of experience in a pharmacy setting.
- ✦ Obtain a minimum score on the Pharmacy College Admissions Test (PCAT).
- ✦ Submit all application materials including two letters of reference (one of which must be from a pharmacist).
- ✦ Interview successfully with the Program's faculty.
- ✦ Meet the Doctor of Pharmacy Program's Technical Standards for Admission, Promotion, and Graduation.

A Physician Assistant GAPDP student must meet the following requirements in order to matriculate into Mercer's PA Program:

- ✦ Complete of all pre-physician assistant coursework at Mercer's CLA (90 semester hours in-residence).
- ✦ Maintain an overall grade point average (GPA) of 3.0, as well as a 3.0 GPA in all natural science courses for the pre-physician assistant core and major. Grades of "C" or above must be earned in all pre-physician assistant courses.
- ✦ Document 1,000 hours of clinical experience involving direct patient care.
- ✦ Obtain a minimum combined (verbal and quantitative sections) score of 1000 on the Graduate Record Exam (GRE).
- ✦ Submit all application materials including three letters of reference. One of the letters must be from a physician assistant or medical doctor and another must be from a University instructor.
- ✦ Interview successfully with the Program's faculty.
- ✦ Meet the Physician Assistant Program's Technical Standards.

Any CLA student that does not qualify for or choose one of the Guaranteed Admission Plus Degree programs may apply to the PA or Pharm.D. program by following the normal admissions procedure.

## Financial Assistance

Financing a graduate or professional education at a private university is a major concern of many students. A private university is more expensive than a state institution because it does not have the state-funded tax support. Instead, a private university relies heavily on its own resources, donations, and endowments—as well as income from tuition—to furnish each student with a superior education. Throughout history, Mercer has worked to assure that the cost of private education does not deter able students from attending.

The Student Financial Planning Office provides information and assistance to students who need funds to attend the College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences. Mercer believes that the primary responsibility for a student's educational costs rests with the student and their family. Financial assistance is available only for meeting the difference between the potential resources (such as family's contribution, student's summer earnings, outside scholarships, etc.) and expenses. This assistance may include a combination of scholarships, loans, grants, and part-time employment. Typically, 85 percent of our students receive financial aid.

Each student who wants to be considered for financial aid must submit their FAFSA electronically and the Mercer Application for Financial Assistance (sent directly to Mercer's Student Financial Planning Office). The Mercer Application for Financial Assistance is available in January of each year. The Student Financial Planning Office staff is available to assist students with the financial aid process.

### The Cecil B. Day Graduate and Professional Campus

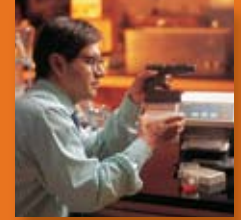
Mercer University's Cecil B. Day Graduate and Professional Campus is located just off Chamblee-Tucker Road near the intersection of Interstate 85 and Interstate 285 in northeast metropolitan Atlanta.

The campus' 220 wooded acres create a serene and secluded atmosphere despite its close proximity to downtown Atlanta. Along with the College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences, the McAfee School of Theology, and the Georgia Baptist College of Nursing, graduate programs offered through Mercer's Stetson School of Business and Economics, Tift College of Education, College of Continuing and Professional Studies, and the University's English Language Institute are housed on the Atlanta campus.

Mercer's Atlanta campus is as secure as it is lovely. The campus is staffed 24 hours a day with professionally-trained police officers who furnish helpful, friendly assistance with parking, vehicle problems, building access, and safety.

On-campus apartments are available and their monthly rent includes many utilities including internet access, local phone, and basic cable. In addition, over 20 apartment complexes are situated within a five- to 15-minute drive of the campus.
